IT'S TRUMP, AGAIN

Republicans take the Senate, could make gains in House

Donald J. Trump, once the 45th President of the United States and recently, a convicted felon, has won over 270 votes to make him the 47th President-elect after the Associated Press called Wisconsin for Trump around 2:30 AM our time Wednesday.

The race came down to the swing states in which all seven-including North Pennsylvania, Georgia, Carolina, Wisconsin, Michigan, and two others leaning Trump, Nevada and Arizona-secured Trump's second term overnight.

Vice President Kamala Harris (D), conceded without questioning the validity of the election results and instead called Trump to offer her congratulations and invited him to the White House to begin the transition.

Trump will be sworn in January 20, 2025 at 12:00 PM Eastern.

Correa reelected to Congress; Republicans take control of the House of Representatives

He's done it again. Congressman Lou Correa (D), first elected in 2016, is projected to reelected to represent California's 46th district in the House Repreof sentatives.

According to election Correa has thrown his hat for the 2026 Attorney General race, leaving the door open for the 46th district to have a special election in one of the last Democratic strongholds in Orange County.

The data from the **Orange** County Registrar of Voters at time of print shows a large amount of newly registered Republicans countywide, dusting Democratic registrations and overtaking voter turnout as well.

Among the handful of seats left in the House, Republicans are on their way to secure a few more despite a tough battle surrounding Congressional districts Orange County. The GOP leads 206 to 191, to perhaps take the majority 218.

If the Republicans take the majority in the House of Representatives, the GOP will achieve a red sweep taking allthree branches of government: White the House, the Congress, and \mathbf{the} Supreme InCourt. some instances, the lack of a supermajority will stall some bills.
